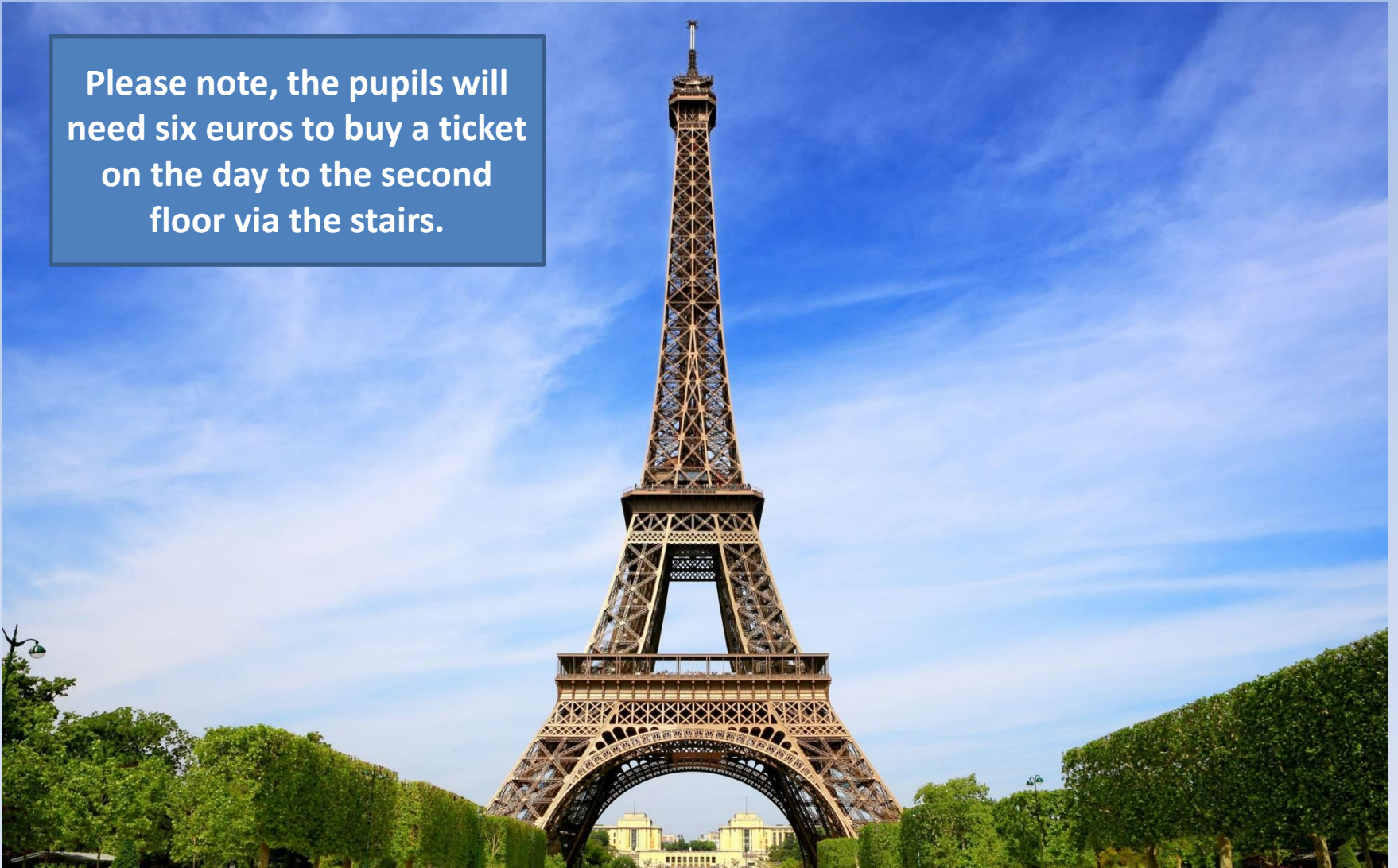

# Safety

- Each teacher will be responsible for 10 students.

## Statement regarding Brexit from Tour Company:

We have no indication that Brexit will have any impact on the right of British citizens to travel to Europe after 29 March 2019. Britain currently lies outside of the Schengen Area and as a result passport controls are currently in place when travelling to and from the UK. Please be reassured that we monitor advice issued by the Foreign and Commonwealth Office relating to the impact of Brexit. At present we do not anticipate making any changes to our groups' travel plans and expect all tours to proceed as normal.
