AEROSPACE SYSTEMS OPERATOR

As an RAF Aerospace Systems Operator you'll manage some of the world's most sophisticated sensors, communications and computer information systems to search the skies for potential threats. This is a great opportunity if you are interested in analysis and maths, want to travel the World and be creative. The minimum age is 16 years of age and there are fitness requirements.

The starting salary will be £17,000 and on completion of training will rise to £18,800 with the potential for promotion. Service in the Royal Air Force attracts extensive health and other benefits.

GCSEs in English and Maths are essential. An interest in computing will be an advantage, as will evidence of completing outdoor activities including the Duke of Edinburgh Award. You will also be required to pass the Airman Selection Test and the General Fitness Test.

The working week will be 40 – 45 hours per week and be based on a shift system involving early morning and late evening shifts, seven days per week.

You will be part of a team controlling offensive, defensive and combat support aircraft to intercept and if necessary destroy hostile and rogue aircraft. You may need to pass information to Royal Navy, Army and other air forces. You will also be on standby to go anywhere in the World to support aircrew and ground troops.

The successful candidate will show evidence of working in a team and be able to stay calm under pressure.
