We have students who are having to self-isolate either because they are waiting for a test result as they have symptoms of COVID-19, they have been identified as a close contact or because a family member has tested positive. If this is the case the school will provide support for these students to work at home. It will not be possible for self-isolating students to access lessons remotely in school, other than in the Sixth Form. I am sure will appreciate that teachers will be preparing and delivering lesson for their classes in school and will not have the capacity to do this and also to set individualised work for students who are absent from school.

We will be providing parents with an outline of the curriculum content that will be covered for the two weeks after we have been notified of a self-isolation absence, which is the longest period of time that a student could be self-isolating for. This will be a summary of the work that will be covered in school for each subject and guidance on how to access resources and online lessons. These resources will predominately be available via the National Oak Academy. This is an online curriculum which has been developed nationally to support students working from home during the coronavirus pandemic.
