

Consequence System


- 1. Warning is given.
- 2. Student is moved seats.
- 3. Detention takes place at break or lunch time that day and with subject teacher.
- 4. BP is logged on SIMS and parents notified via SIMS C1 notification.


- 1. Subject teacher logs consequence on SIMS and notification is sent home the same day.
- 2. <u>30min Middle Leaders</u> detention takes place the following day in detention room.
- 3. Restorative conversation takes place.

- 1. Day in internal isolation (following day).
- 2. Any student internally excluded will have an extended school day until 3.50pm in BASE.

Rewards

- All House Points awarded will be recorded on SIMS.
- Once a week (silent reading), tutors will add the previous weeks HP stamps to tutees and initial/sign their cards.

Attendance and Punctuality

- Each student needs to have 97% attendance
- Appointments outside of school hours where possible

- "pupils with no absence are 2.8 times more likely to achieve 5+ GCSEs A*-C including English and mathematics than pupils missing 15-20% of KS4 lessons." (DfE February 2015)



Two reserve options:


- once all of the forms have been returned we will consider the timetable for next year;

Oldfield Flightpaths






Homework club




- This club has recommenced as of 6th Sept.
