Dear Parents/Carers

In this, the last newsletter of the year, I would like to begin by reflecting on what has been a very busy and rewarding first year as Headteacher at Oldfield School. I would like to thank our students, staff and parents for the warm welcome on my arrival and for their ongoing support during the year. Amongst the many positive experiences since last September, the highlights of the year for me have been participating in the Year 9 Battlefields trip, the Year 11 celebration assembly and prom and the opportunity to spend time, on a daily basis, with our students at lunch or break; in particular at this time of the year on Penn Field. I have been impressed by, and grateful of, the commitment shown by teaching and support staff throughout the year and the efforts that they have made to support our students.

The year has drawn to a close with our school production and sports day. We involved the whole school with sports day for the first time with our entire student body either participating or spectating throughout the day. We were blessed by excellent weather, warm but not too hot and it was a very enjoyable day with a tight finish during the relay resulting in Austen winning the House competition. Our school production, 'Oliver!' ran for three nights last week and played to a busy house each night, with Friday having a full hall. The months of work put into the preparations by staff and students paid off with a very professional and entertaining show being the result. Particular reference must be made to the efforts of Mrs Bloomfield, Miss Grimes, Mrs Robinson and Mrs Macnaughton for their dedication in ensuring the cast were well prepared.

The selection process for our school prefects has been completed and 24 successful applicants have started to carry out their responsibilities. This is a new venture for the school and I have been very impressed with the response from our Year 10 students and their enthusiasm for the role. We will be selecting a student leadership team (Head Girl/Boy and their deputies) from the prefect body early next year.

You will be pleased to know that our refurbishment programme will get underway during the summer holiday and the first stage of this will be to refurbish the stable block at Penn. This will involve installing new windows, carpets and furniture as well as the whole building being repainted. We will also be completing similar work in the Sixth Form area and other rooms on the second floor of Penn. Both areas are very much in need of this work and the learning environment in both will be transformed. In total we will be spending almost £100,000 in these areas over the summer and I hope that we will be able to enhance other teacher areas during the year.

There are a number of points of information for parents with regards to the start of the new school year. There is an inset day on Friday 1st September and the first school day for Year 7, Year 10 and Year 12 is Monday 4th September and for Year 10, 12 this will include their GCSE / Sixth Form Induction Day. Years 8, 9, 11 and 13 will start on Tuesday 5th September.

I am sure that you will join me in wishing the staff leaving us well in the future and in their new careers and ventures. Of our staff leavers a number have secured promotions elsewhere, most notably Rhian Davies, who has been appointed to a senior leadership position at Wellsway School. Some of our staff are leaving or taking a break from the teaching profession, including Celia Trevan who will be travelling around the world over the next year and Miss MacKellar-Still who will be working in the travel industry in South America. Two of our support staff; Chloe Jenkins and Laura Lowes are starting teacher training courses in September and I am delighted that their experience of working at the school has reaffirmed their desire to follow a career in education. Regarding staffing I am pleased to inform you that the school is fully staffed for next year with specialist teachers in all of our subject areas.

While all schools are similar, they are also different in many, often quite subtle, ways and this is usually related to the nature, ethos and character of the students. We are very fortunate to have outstanding young people at the school and I am determined to ensure that we continue to provide them with the best possible opportunities, facilities and experiences.

I hope that you and they have a very enjoyable and relaxing summer.

Changes to our Pastoral structure

There are changes to the pastoral structure from September following a review undertaken over the last two terms. We have decided to structure the pastoral team on a year group basis and this will mean that the main point of contact for pastoral issues (other than your child's tutor) will be the Head of Year. I appreciate that this will mean that for many students their pastoral head will change in September but for the very great majority of students their tutor will remain the same.

We have carefully considered the relative merits of a House based structure as against a Year based structure and feel that the latter will be more effective and appropriate for the school. A year based approach will allow us to better focus on the needs, which vary significantly, of each separate cohort and ensure a consistent approach to pastoral issues across the year group. Miss Ryan is a new member of staff joining the MFL Department and was appointed as a replacement for Miss B Davies who is leaving us at the end of this term. The intention is for these Heads of Year to stay with their year groups as they progress through the school.

As a consequence of this change we have also appointed new Heads of House. These posts will not have a pastoral role as the current Heads of House do (the Heads of Year will have this role). They will be managing House events, activities and competitions and building a house spirit and ethos. The Heads of House will be: Mr Gann (Palmer); Mrs Macnaughton (Holburne); Miss Vickery (Shelley) and Mr Fox (Austen).

Our Year 10 boys came runners up in the plate, with some brilliant performances against some very strong Welsh teams.




Senior Rounders

UKMT Maths challenges 2017

We have had another excellent year with students competing in the national Maths challenge, in which thousands of students compete every year. Over 500,00 pupils from across the UK sat the challenges, with roughly the top 6% achieving a gold certificate. We are very proud to announce 2 of our students, out of those that competed, achieved gold; Dan Weston 10D and Nathan Motean 8S.

The next 13% of pupils from the UK achieve silver medals and again we are proud to have had 16 students in this category; Jack Gibert, Joey Williams, Joaquin McLoughlin, Hamdi Saleem, Izzeldeen Abumatar, Faris Kahtan, William Ormes Roder, Ruby Mills, Zoe Burr, Molly Lander, Maddie Haag, Henry Court, Tate Hopkins, Ruby Pearce, Declan Tugwel, Freya Rotheram. The next 21% of pupils receive a bronze medal, and we had 29 students achieve this level.

Approximately 6800 of the top students in each competition are invited to sit a follow-on competition. This year, Nathan Motean competed in the Kangaroo paper. Dan Weston competed in the Pink Kangaroo paper and Joey Williams 9S in the Grey Kangaroo paper.

Oldfield School Sponsored Walk
