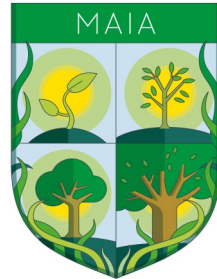

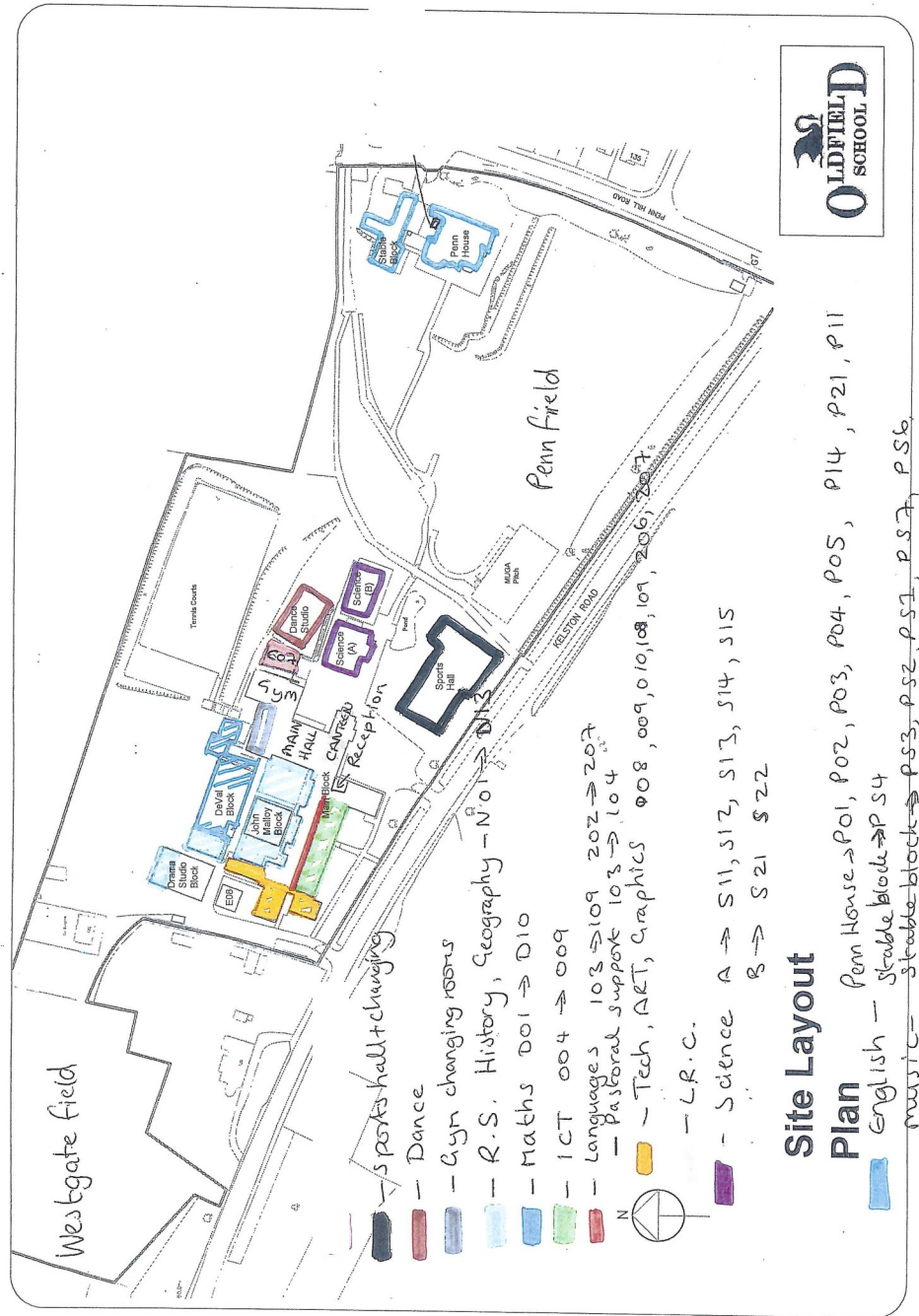

Organisation Tips

You'll have to remember lots of things when you start such as books, equipment and homework.

- ◆ Plan ahead! Use your timetable to check what books and equipment you need to pack. Pin up your timetable somewhere where you can easily see it.
- ◆ Work out your own routine for what you need to do the evening before (e.g. homework, packing bag) so you can be relaxed and punctual in the morning.
- ◆ Pack your bag the night before.

Homework

Homework – the more organised you are; the less amount of time you will have to spend doing it. In Year 7 you start to get more homework than you have been used to. Teachers will be stricter about getting it done and handed in on time. However, teachers are also there to help you if you are stuck so you should always ask them about anything before the task deadline.



To help you be successful in organising your homework, you will be able to access it on 'Satchel:one'. It tells you the dates it needs to be in and teachers can upload information about the task so you don't need to worry about forgetting what was said in class!

Equipment

At Oldfield school, you will be expected to have your own pencils, pens, ruler, rubber and calculator. You will be told what type of calculator to purchase. You will have to carry them with you. These are the most important items to bring to school.
